What is Hospice?

Hospice is a unique, specialized kind of care for those diagnosed with a life-limiting illness. Hospice cares for the physical, spiritual, and emotional needs of the patient. Support is extended to the patient's family and caregivers as well. At the center of hospice is the belief that each of us has the right to die pain-free and with dignity, and that our families will receive the necessary support to allow us to do so. The focus is on caring, not curing.

Hospice offers support to people of all ages affected by grief and loss. Your school has a Hospice counselor available to students who have experienced the loss of someone they care about.

Who does Hospice serve?

HospiceCare of the Piedmont, Inc. serves Abbeville, Greenwood, Laurens, McCormick, and Saluda counties. We care for more than 300 patients per year. Care usually takes place in the patients home or a home-like setting.

Can I volunteer?
